

# Winter Fun – Showcase

### DISTRICT OF HOPE

Just like the rest of the year, Hope Communities in Bloom volunteers continue to work to make our community a better place.



In early December, volunteers gathered a variety of greens and holly from backyards and nearby forests and pre-bagged them for the 20 planters downtown. CiB members sorted the Christmas lights for installation by the District crew. The Grinch carving was put back in place in front of District Hall to allow for selfies and family photos. The Christmas tree was installed on the District Hall roof and the lights were turned on by the Mayor, Victor Smith, (Hope's CiB chair for many years) at an evening celebration.

Chainsaw carving maintenance continues. Carvings need to be sanded and cracks filled. New stain and paint is applied with many coats of preservative to ensure more seasons out in the elements.

March will bring a calendar for litter pickups. New vests with the Hope CiB logo on the back have been ordered. Hope CiB Earth Day will feature collections of batteries, cell phones, paint, metal, tires and other items not picked up with recycling. Volunteers will also plan for new May street planter displays featuring the color purple.

And planning has now started for the 2023 Hope Chainsaw Carving Competition August 17-20. The event is held every two years and interest is high. Many carvers from throughout North America have confirmed, newbies and competition winners, and this promises to be the biggest year ever. ## **ADDITIONAL DETAILS:**

- Grow a local 'in Bloom' committee to build collaboration with residents, businesses, service clubs and a municipal rep. (Councillor, Public Works, Administration or Parks & Recreation staff).
- Plan to meet online mid-season with Provincial CiB Judges with a Virtual Check Up on how to support your CiB efforts.
- Develop a basic budget to cover registration fee and to create community wide CiB awareness projects, i.e.: parades, tidy up days. Consider planning some fundraising events too. Document volunteer contributions.
- Create a Community Profile Document outlining the community's achievements. Plan a judge's tour to view community in the 3 or 6 evaluation criteria. (Once registered, additional information is provided in the Getting Started Package).
- Host 2-judges in 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> week of July (TBC), in separate rooms (Hotel, B&B or Billeting if certain conditions can be met), with meals during evaluation day.
- Communities will be presented a Certificate and a Report at the Provincial Awards in the fall. (Event details to be confirmed)
- Evaluating three or six criteria, the report creates a benchmark score to celebrate successes and for future improvements.

# **NON-EVALUATED OPTIONS**

**FRIENDS** For communities that want recognition for ongoing CiB initiatives but want to take time off from evaluation. Bonus: this category is encouraged to provide a Showcase Project.

**SHOWCASE PROJECT (requires separate form)** Recognition program for individuals, communities, and neighbourhoods of all sizes. Showcase a place or space and how you are using CiB to make a better community, and world. Acknowledge your volunteers.
