PROGRAM BENEFITS:

- Strengthens community pride for residents and businesses
- Collaborative, creates opportunities to celebrate volunteers
- Enhances enjoyment and value of green spaces
- Highlights climate action initiatives
- Contributes to a healthy social & economic lifestyle
- Profile for best features of the Community
- Measurable results with year over year benefits

ADDITIONAL DETAILS:

- Grow a local 'in Bloom' committee to build collaboration with residents, businesses, service clubs and a municipal rep. (Councillor, Public Works, Administration or Parks & Recreation staff).
- Plan to meet online mid-season with Provincial CiB Judges with a Virtual Check Up on how to support your CiB efforts.
- Develop a basic budget to cover registration fee and to create community wide CiB awareness projects, i.e.: parades, tidy up
 days. Consider planning some fundraising events too. Document volunteer contributions.
- Create a Community Profile Document outlining the community's achievements. Plan a judge's tour to view community in the 3 or 6 evaluation criteria. (Once registered, additional information is provided in the Getting Started Package).
- Host 2-judges in 2nd or 3rd week of July (TBC), in separate rooms (Hotel, B&B or Billeting if certain conditions can be met), with meals during evaluation day.
- Communities will be presented a Certificate and a Report at the Provincial Awards in the fall. (Event details to be confirmed)
- Evaluating three or six criteria, the report creates a benchmark score to celebrate successes and for future improvements.

NON-EVALUATED OPTIONS

FRIENDS For communities that want recognition for ongoing CiB initiatives but want to take time off from evaluation. Bonus: this category is encouraged to provide a Showcase Project. See first page.

SHOWCASE PROJECT (requires separate form) Recognition program for individuals, communities, neighbourhoods of all sizes. Showcase a place or space and how you are using CiB to make a better community, and world. Acknowledge your volunteers.

- Prizes will be awarded for three outstanding submissions.
- Photos must be from the 2024 season.
- Submit 3 of your best photos with full rights in high resolution (a minimum of 300dpi at print size or a minimum weight of 800kb). These photos will be used by BC Communities in Bloom for the promotion of your community and the BC CiB Program.

Judge

Do you like people and plants? Think horticulture is a critical part of community life and wellness?

BC Communities in Bloom is a not-for-profit organization looking for volunteer judges able to train and evaluate at specific times of the year. New judges are paired with a more experienced partner to evaluate communities all over British Columbia.

Prerequisites:

- 1. A committed interest in the Communities in Bloom program and all that it represents.
- 2. Employment experience and/or dedication to horticultural initiatives, with an interest/experience in environmental practices, natural and cultural heritage, tree/urban forestry, landscaping, or floral displays.
- 3. Able to attend a judges training session in early spring.
- 4. Willing to volunteer one week of time in mid-July.
- 5. Able to travel (driving) throughout the province for the evaluation of communities (lots of walking & talking).
- 6. Good communication skills and excellent report writing skills. Allow time after tour for completion of reports.
- 7. Understanding that the time commitment while on tour is intense. Communities expect judges to be available during established tour times and special events.
- 8. Adaptability to the unexpected and an adventurous spirit is an asset!

Board Member

Duties:

The Board of BC Communities in Bloom is a "working board"

- 1. Participate at the meetings of the Board of Directors (mostly by zoom, approx. 6x/year).
- 2. Participate in the development and promotion of BC CiB's objectives.
- 3. Participate in the decision-making process.

Eligibility:

The following are eligible for nomination as Directors of BC Communities in Bloom:

- 1. A member having two (2) years experience as a member at the provincial level; or
- 2. A person with experience in an organization associated with or of relevance to the mission of CiB.

Voting process:

Eligible candidates are invited, prior to the annual general meeting, to submit their name on a nomination form.
