FireSmart™ Communities in Bloom

This Spring, FireSmart BC is launching the FireSmart Plant Program and Landscaping Hub to build awareness of the connection between home gardening & landscaping and wildfire mitigation. The program will be launched in early April and includes participation from over 30 Garden Centres across British Columbia.

As past seasons have proven, wildfire is an important issue in our province.



FireSmart is helping owners take steps in fire prevention through the launch of this program now, in early Spring, in hopes that this awareness campaign will assist in mitigating future wildfires in the Summer.

In addition to the Plant Program, FireSmart has also launched the <u>Landscaping Hub</u> on the FireSmart BC website. This online space features an interactive Fire-Resistant Plants Tool, Landscaping Tips, as well as information on the FireSmart Plant Program including a map of the participating Garden Centres.

The <u>fire-resistant plant tool</u> allows users to easily find out which plants are best suited for their geographical area. It will help British Columbians identify the species that grow best in the specific climate where they live, as finding the right plants lowers the risk of structural damage due to wildfire, and FireSmart selections can also increase sustainability, helping to conserve water and attract pollinators.

Apart from picking the right fire-resistant plants, keeping a property FireSmart also involves some easy-to-do and cost-effective landscaping practices which can be found on the <u>Landscaping Tips & Insights webpage</u>.

The <u>FireSmart BC Plant Program</u> is launching in Garden Centres & Nurseries across the province, where they will display simple, visual tags to allow customers an easy way to see which plants are considered more fire-resistant at the point of purchase.

The launch of the FireSmart Plant Program was widely supported by a number of horticulture experts including Brian Minter of Minter Country Garden in Chilliwack and Karla Hoffman who has vast technical experience in landscapes — from small residential sites to commercial, university, and municipal grounds. In the lead-up to the Landscaping Hub launch, both experts were recently featured as guests on The GetFireSmart Podcast.

So as you are dreaming up your landscape this Spring, refer to the combination of podcast episodes, programs, and online resources from FireSmart BC. The Landscaping Hub has everything you need to ensure your property is beautiful and FireSmart too.
