The event was held in the board room of <u>Urban Systems</u> where we were able to gather and learn about the <u>British Columbia Communities in Bloom</u> program. It was wonderful to see such an enthusiastic group of people with some new and old (what I mean is returning) faces in the room! It truly was a delight to have such positive people gathered to keep the spirit of CiB alive and well.

A key part of the day was a new event for our judges training. We did a mini-evaluation walking tour around the downtown area of the city. Judges spent an hour walking and observing two criteria along a route that took in the sectors of municipal, residential, and business areas with community involvement being subtly witnessed throughout the walk.

After the tour, the judges returned to the board room where we were able to discuss the process of scoring the grid. The volunteers have a good balance of CiB experience, and horticulture knowledge.
