### **Community Showcase – Coquitlam Inspiration Garden and Park Spark**

Created in 2007, the Inspiration Garden began as a compost demonstration garden. Years later, the Inspiration Garden is now a dedicated hub for growing, supporting and connecting gardeners in the community. Coquitlam residents are able to have fun, get involved and learn new skills about gardening within a variety of programming and activities including workshops, tours and garden volunteer opportunities.

# Inspiration Garden workshops for green thumbs of all ages

Participating in exciting garden workshops teaches new techniques, helps participants gain gardening experience and encourages people to get their hands dirty in the best possible way. Workshops are offered at various times during the day, evenings and weekends, so they're accessible to everybody. Workshops are available for all ages and abilities, vary monthly, and run from April through October. School garden tours encourage teachers to bring students to the garden to get hands-on experience, explore, and learn about the benefits of gardening. School tours are offered throughout the school year and cover a wide range of topics including pollinators, composting, plant life cycles and life in the soil.

Drop-in opportunities allow the Coquitlam community to stop by the garden, get a tour, meet their neighbours, and interact with people at the garden; it's all about building a sense of community and the chance for people to connect and share common interests.

#### **Enriching volunteer opportunities**

The Inspiration Garden boasts over 120 active garden volunteers, ranging from experienced gardeners to people just starting out. With no obligation or commitment required, people are able to volunteer at their own pace; just show up, have fun and get involved. Volunteers are able to share resources, gain gardening experience and learn about the importance and benefits of gardening.

There are also over 60 youth volunteers that come out to experience the garden. As part of the Youth Urban Garden team, youth get to learn a little bit about gardening, connect with their outdoor park spaces and gain volunteer experience they might need for school, while also having fun in a positive atmosphere, interacting with other youth.

The Inspiration Garden provides a space for people to "bee inspired", connecting the community to their outdoor park spaces and enhancing park experiences.
