Sicamous is a small Shuswap community surrounded by picturesque lakes, mountains, and rivers within the Traditional and ancestral lands of the Secwepemc. Sicamous' motto is "Live More" and we take a unique approach to our gardens by merging landscapes and art into active spaces where we can work and play.

Our community gardens and tributes honour Sicamous' diverse history which encompasses military veterans,

houseboating and the railroad while honouring those impacted by Japanese and Ukrainian internment camps in the area. Sicamous is famous for being the Houseboat Capital of Canada and is widely known for its snowmobiling. Council proclaimed 2022 as the Year of the Garden and Sicamous is proud to be a Destination Garden Community on Canada's Garden Route.

The City of Armstrong is a rural community, with a commercial downtown boasting historical with modern buildings. A railroad runs through the centre of town with 41 concrete petunia baskets poised on top of a brick wall transforming the railroad into a floral landscape feature.

Armstrong is balanced with young families to fill seven schools and many retired residents who enjoy a laid-back lifestyle. Located halfway between Vancouver and Calgary the community hosts up to 150,000 people during our world renowned Interior Provincial Exhibition on the Labour Day weekend.

<u>WinterLife Award, by Municipal World</u> - The objective of this award is to recognize efforts and involvement in projects and initiatives which engage the community with indoor and outdoor activities from November through March. The <u>deadline</u> <u>is</u> August 26th, 2022

<u>NFL School Garden Award</u> – Nutrients for Life, a proud partner of Communities in Bloom, is offering a \$500 grant to support a local school garden, open to all Canadian communities registered (all editions) in the Communities in Bloom program. the <u>deadline</u> <u>is</u> August 31, 2022.

<u>CiB Foundation Bursary – 2022 Claudette Savaria</u> <u>Bursary</u> - Each year, the Foundation awards two bursaries to two students registered in a full-time post-secondary program pertaining to ornamental and/or environmental horticulture in an accredited institution and who are involved with their local Communities in Bloom committee, in the national or provincial editions.
