

10:00 Abkhazi Garden – The Garden That Love Built Cathy Armstrong - ED of The Land Conservancy of BC

Join us to learn about the role the community played in saving Abkhazi Garden from being developed into 12 townhomes in the year 2000. This unique garden weaves together a magical love story steeped in the ravages of war and the subsequent reuniting of two very special people who created a garden together. Prince Nicolas and Princess Peggy Abkhazi carefully chose plants from the finest nurseries of the day to enhance the natural beauty of dramatic glaciated rocky slopes and magnificent native Garry Oaks.

It is the Abkhazis' response to this landscape that qualifies it as a stunning example of West Coast design. The garden flows around the rock, taking advantage of deeper pockets of soil for conifers, Japanese maples, and rhododendrons. Over 50 volunteers maintain this exquisite heritage garden and share the Abkhazi story with visitors from all over the world.



11:00 Reconnecting People to Plants, Wildlife and the Planet Brian Minter – World Renowned Gardening Expert

As we embrace a changing climate, everything we do requires a new focus and thought process. The plants we choose must not only be more heat and drought tolerant but also pollinator and bird friendly. 
